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519. 22 MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT

BACKGROUND

Historically, West Virginia has covered mental health counseling and substance abuse treatment and partnered with other state and community agencies in the delivery of these services.

POLICY

West Virginia Medicaid covers various aspects of mental health counseling and substance abuse treatment services. Providers who wish to offer substance abuse treatment must meet specific criteria. Providers who choose to render medication-assisted treatment must be approved by West Virginia Medicaid.

Physicians that provide substance abuse services may have appropriate master's degreed licensed staff working under them to provide these services which include the following: Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker (LICSW), Licensed Certified Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Graduate Social Worker (LGSW), and Licensed Psychologist (LP).
